Post Incident Decontamination Procedure

309.1 PURPOSE AND SCOPE

Listed below are the steps to be taken after an incident that requires decontamination of equipment, PPE and personnel.

309.2 ESTABLISH A DECONTAMINATION AREA

- (a) Use suppression apparatus for a water source.
- (b) Decon area should be away from apparatus, smoke and other on scene activities.
- (c) Water should flow away and not form a pool of contaminated water.
- (d) Second arriving Driver will set up the area with the green cone, hose and other equipment.

309.3 GROSS DECON

- (a) Due to PPE off gassing and the high threat of particulates that need to be avoided, remain on air from your SCBA during this process.
- (b) Crew members will decon each other.
- (c) Brush off large debris. Always brush away or downwards, never towards the center of the body or face.
- (d) Cover electronics including the SCBA speaker, radio and lapel mic.
- (e) Rinse with soapy water solution and then water. Start at the top and work down taking caution around openings to prevent soaking the inner liner of the PPE.

309.4 GEAR DROP ZONE

- (a) Place gear in a clean area away from the decon area and other activities.
- (b) Remove SCBA and take hood and mask off in one movement while holding your breath.
- (c) Take care not to cross contaminate when removing gear and gloves.
- (d) Lay gear out to dry in a way that it can be used again at the incident if needed.

309.5 PERSONAL DECON

- (a) Use a decon wipe on your SCBA mask seal and helmet brim.
- (b) Use a decon wipe to clean exposed skin.
 - 1. Begin with face and then neck (front and back along with ears).
 - 2. Entire head from front to back.
 - 3. Wipe arms, hands, and fingernails.

- 4. Wipe underarms, body, and stomach.
- 5. Blow your nose and wipe nostrils.

309.6 REHAB

- (a) Rehab area should be kept free of cross contamination.
- (b) Record vital signs.
- (c) Hydrate with water or sports drinks, not sodas or coffee.
- (d) Combat environmental factors (heat/cold).

309.7 LEAVING THE SCENE

- (a) Bag Gear in a clear plastic bag, double taping the bag. Gear can be kept in the cab when bagged.
- (b) Gear may be used if needed for emergency response prior to swapping or cleaning.

309.8 RETURNING TO THE STATION

- (a) Use EMS gloves and eye protection when cleaning.
- (b) Warm soapy water for equipment:
 - 1. SCBA, facemask, radio strap, helmet, boots, flashlight, TIC.
- (c) Use decon wipes to clean inside helmet, radio,
- (d) Employees should shower and change uniform as soon as possible but after equipment has been cleaned so that recontamination does not occur.
